Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure

Report to Parents

Overview of the school

2014/15

Pupil premium is additional funding that Bookwell Primary School receives from the Government to help us to close the attainment gap between children from low-income and other disadvantaged families and their peers. Children who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), will receive the funding. The funding also covers children in care aged 4-15 who have been looked after continuously for more than 6 months. A service premium has also been introduced for children whose parents are serving in the armed forces.

Nature of support 2014/15

The extra funding is continuing to be used to fund teaching assistants and additional teaching assistants, who are used to support pupil premium pupils in class.

Relevant pupils are clearly identified on the school's tracking system so that evidence of their performance is clear.

Teachers are very clear about the pupil's gaps in learning and Teaching assistant support is used to target these gaps in learning.

The Leadership team, carefully track and analyse pupil progress to ensure that pupils are given the support they need to achieve their expected progress.

The nature of the support includes: targeted teaching assistant support, small group work, 1:1 support for Speech and Language, Phonic, Literacy and maths support, structured reading, nurture provision, specific needs focussed assessment eg Dyslexia, social stories and anger management.

We have provided curriculum enrichment opportunities for pupils in all year groups.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

In the core subjects standards remain above average at the end of both key stages for ALL pupils.

Key Stage 2

Pupil Premium pupils:

Attainment

Provisional Key stage 2 results show at Level 4:

100% of pupil premium pupils attained level 4 in reading

78% of pupil premium pupils attained level 4 in spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG)

100% of pupil premium pupils attained level 4 in maths.

Progress

Provisional results for Key Stage Two show that in 2014 / 2015 ALL pupil premium pupils made at least expected progress.

44% exceeded expected progress in SPAG, 22 % in maths and 56% in reading.

Provisional Key stage 2 results show at Level 5:

56% of pupil premium pupils attained level 5 in SPAG, 67% attained Level 5 in reading, 22% attained Level 5 in maths

Key Stage 1

At the end of Key Stage 1 pupils were in line with National expectation in reading, writing and maths.

Pupil premium pupils:

Attainment

100% pupil premium pupils attained 2B+ in reading, writing and maths. This represented at least good progress from their starting points in school.

In both key stages the progress for those children accessing **Free School Meals** is good or outstanding.

The spending for 2015/2016 will be targeted on the older pupils to ensure rapid catch up on SPAG
