Your child could share a book everyday. This could be reading a book aloud everyday or sharing a book with an adult and just listening or talking about what you have read.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read the next chapter in your to do folder on purple mash with an adult – they may need to read it to you then complete the activity based on it Your child could read a story/poem/nursery rhyme to another family member. This could be to a younger sibling before bedtime or they may wish to telephone/videocall a relative (with adult supervision of course). Discuss how it may be similar or the same to your birthday celebration.

Spelling Shed activities set by Mrs Fawcett Purple mash complete the activities Mrs Fawcett has set in your 2do folder <p>Daily letters and sounds – try and log onto the daily lesson that follows letters and sounds programme that we use in school.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Handwriting watch the zig zag letter w and then print the worksheet or copy the letters down into your home learning book which will help them practise the letter 'v'. Read Pippety's favourite poem (on seesaw) and then write your own poem about if you had wings Pippety's rainbow treasure hunt (on seesaw). Go on a treasure hunt then write sentences about what you find using words like first, next, then, finally.
