See if you find about someone in your family that lived during World War 2. You might be able to find photos or ask grandparents about any family stories they might know.

### **Flags are Flying**

A national holiday was declared on 8th May 1945 and red, white and blue bunting could be bought without ration coupons. Make your own bunting or flag to decorate your VE Day celebrations.

### **Battle Ships**

The battle of the Atlantic was the longest campaign of WWII running from 1939 until Germany's defeat in 1945.

### **Party Time**

Find out about some other foods that would have been popular in WWII and served at VE Day street parties up and down the country (you can use curriculum visions for this). Can you make a picnic/cake to celebrate the anniversary of VE day with your family or teddy bears?

Street parties happened across the country on 8th May 1945 and street games were a must for children. Play your own street game. From chants and chalk to ball games and treasure hunts, there are lots of games that can be played outside. Why not adapt a game you know with a VE Day twist?
