- Look at the drawings of a city called Pompeii in Italy on Seesaw. Write a list of all the things you can see. Discuss with an adult:

Where do you think this place might be?

What might the people be doing?

What are the people wearing?

What does this tell us about the time it was drawn?

- Look at the activity: Eruption of Mount Vesuvius TIMELINE on Seesaw. It will direct you to a link showing the events of what happened in order of time. Then draw your own timeline and write between 8 and 10 short sentences to describe what happened from start to finish.
- Look at the activity: DIARY ENTRY: ERUPTION OF THE SLEEPING GIANT MOUNT VESUVIUS on Seesaw. It shows a drawing illustrating the moment the volcano 'Mount Vesuvius' erupted. Imagine you are the small child in the drawing. Write a diary entry to describe what you could see, hear, feel, touch and smell at that moment in time.
