Weekly Writing Tasks

- Watch the video 'Rang Tan' (look in the activities section on Seesaw) In your home learning book write a few sentences to explain:
 - What is Rang Tan doing in the bedroom?
 - Why is Rang Tan there?
 - What is palm oil?
 - What do you think the word 'deforestation' means?
 - Why is palm oil an important reason why rainforests are being destroyed?
- Read the information about Palm Oil (Look on Seesaw in activities) Go on a search around your house to see if you can find any items with palm oil as an ingredient. Write a list of any items you find in your home learning book.
- Write an acrostic poem using the word R, A, I, N, F, O, R, E, S, T. It's up to you whether you want to make it rhyme or not. I have added a template to the end of this sheet that can be printed off and stuck into your home learning book.
