- Visit [Daily 10](#) and opt for Level 2. Throughout the week choose one of the following to practise:
 - ✓ Digit Values (up to 99, then Level 3 up to 999)
 - ✓ Division (÷2, ÷5, ÷10)
 - ✓ Fractions (Half of amounts to 24 then 40 if secure).
 - ✓ Ordering Numbers (Smallest first then largest).

Show your workings **if needed** in your home learning book.

Weekly Reading Tasks

- Continue to read a variety of books every day and record in your reading records. Remember you also have access to the E-Library on [Oxford Owl](#) using your password in your home learning pack.
- Sit down with a snack and listen to a story from the website:

- Record yourself reading a page from your current reading book then upload onto Seesaw. Listen back to your reading, what did you do well? What might you do to improve it?
- Read the story of 'The Great Kapok Tree', a tale from the Amazon rainforest (Look in the activities section on Seesaw). Answer the question on the page. Will the man listen to the child and animals or not?

Weekly Writing Tasks

- Work through this English lesson on BBC Bitesize, [Using capital letters, full stops and conjunctions](#) then write your sentences in your home learning book.
 - Find 5 words that you have never heard of before in 'The Great Kapok Tree' and use a dictionary to find out what they mean. Then write in your home learning book.
 - Choose 5 of the animals from the story of 'The Great Kapok Tree' and write their reason why the man should not chop down the kapok tree. ie
- Box Constrictor:** The Kapok tree is his home where generations of his ancestors have lived.
- Write a letter to the man in the story of 'The Great Kapok Tree' from the point of view of the animals in the rainforest, persuading him not to chop the tree down and why the rainforest is so important.

Afternoon Activities

History: Watch the video of VE day celebrations (Look at the activities section on Seesaw) then read the information (a separate activity on Seesaw). Talk with your family about how you could celebrate the occasion. Could you throw a house party? Decorate the house with bunting? Make cakes?

Science: Continue to watch your plant grow and photograph any changes you see. Perhaps you could also keep a record in cm of how tall they have grown each week.

RE: Learn about the festival of Passover, an important part of Jewish faith by following the activities on the link. [The Story of the Passover](#) There is also a brilliant film called 'The Prince of Egypt' by Dreamworks which is available to watch on Amazon Prime telling the story of Moses.

DT: Make a house like one in Kampong Ayer using whatever you can find around your house, you might want to use lego, sticks, cereal boxes, toilet rolls, egg boxes whatever you can get your hands on! Remember they need to be on stilts so that they are above water.
