Memories

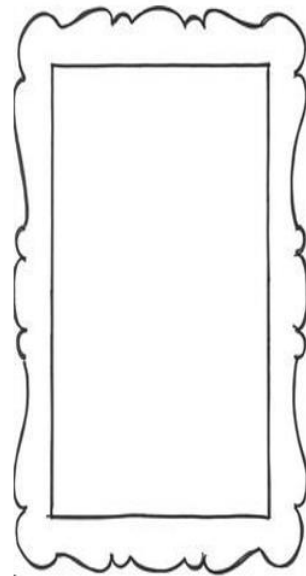
