<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Get your child to play on Times Table Rockstars for 5 – 10 minutes a day. Daily arithmetic for different areas of maths. Ask your child to work on level 4, 5 and 6 activities and try to focus on fractions. Effective Maths Lesson 1 Effective Maths Lesson 2 Mathletics – minimum of 300 points please. Some activities have been assigned but you can also access Live Mathletics etc. Mathsquiz on fractions. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library. Get them to summarise the chapter and to predict what might happen next. Access Audible and carry on listening to a story. Design a book cover (front and back) for a story about your life. Make it reflect your personality. Add a few quotes from friends and family.
Weekly Spelling Tasks	Weekly Writing Task
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Encourage your child to practise the Year 5/ 6 Common Exception Words (see list on seesaw) Then ask your child to choose 5 Common Exception words. They can then write a synonym, antonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Practise spellings on Spelling Shed assignment. Using the word 'break' as the root, find as many words as you can in the family e.g. breaks etc. Do a mind map with break in the middle. 	<p>Your task this week is to write a diary in role as a Spartan boy. You are going to write three entries; one when he is 7 (being taken away from his family), one when he is 12 (combat trials), and one when he is 19 (waiting to go to war). Make it colourful, eye-catching and thought-provoking. Upload a pic of it into Seesaw.
