Learning Project WEEK 3	
Age Range: Y6	
Weekly Maths Tasks	Weekly Reading Tasks
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Get your child to play on <a href="#">Times Table Rockstars</a>.</li> <li>● Daily <a href="#">arithmetic</a> for different areas of maths. Ask your child to work on level 4, 5 and 6 activities and try to focus on fractions.</li> <li>● <a href="#">Effective Maths Lesson 1</a></li> <li>● <a href="#">Effective Maths Lesson 2</a></li> <li>● <a href="#">Mathletics</a> – minimum of 300 points please. Some activities have been assigned but you can also access Live Mathletics etc.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library.</li> <li>● Following this, ask your child to create a set of comprehension style questions and answers for the chapter.</li> <li>● Encourage your child to note down any unfamiliar words from the chapter they have read. Explore the meanings of these words by using a dictionary, reading around the sentence or using print conventions.</li> <li>● Access <a href="#">Audible</a> and carry on listening to a story.</li> <li>● Research your favourite author – most have their own websites.</li> </ul>
Weekly Spelling Tasks	Weekly Writing Task
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Encourage your child to practise the Year 5/ 6 Common Exception Words (see list on seesaw)</li> <li>● Then ask your child to choose 5 Common Exception words. They can then write a synonym, antonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence.</li> <li>● Practise spellings on <a href="#">Spelling Shed</a> assignment.</li> <li>● Using the word 'Clean' as the root, find as many words as you can in the family e.g. unclean, cleaning etc. Do a mind map with clean in the middle.</li> </ul>	<p>Watch the video of <a href="#">‘Donning the Hoplite Panoply’</a>. You will need to watch a few times – it’s quite funny so it won’t be a hardship! Take notes of the steps as you watch the second time. Access the instructions examples on Seesaw. Annotate the features and save into your Seesaw. Your task is to write a full set of instructions for ‘How to Don the Hoplite Panoply’. I want Year 6 instructions with safety notes and lots of higher-level punctuation (like brackets, dashes, semi-colons etc). You will need to write using the correct terminology for the panoply so google the spellings please. You could draw and label the panoply too to add interest and colour to your work. (Please note: I will ask you to repeat this work if it does not meet Year 6 standard!)</p>
