Please ensure your child brings a pencil with you to school every day. We don't like to waste time looking for and borrowing pencils in class.

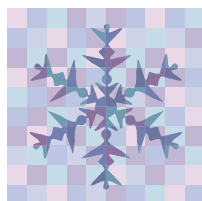


READING
