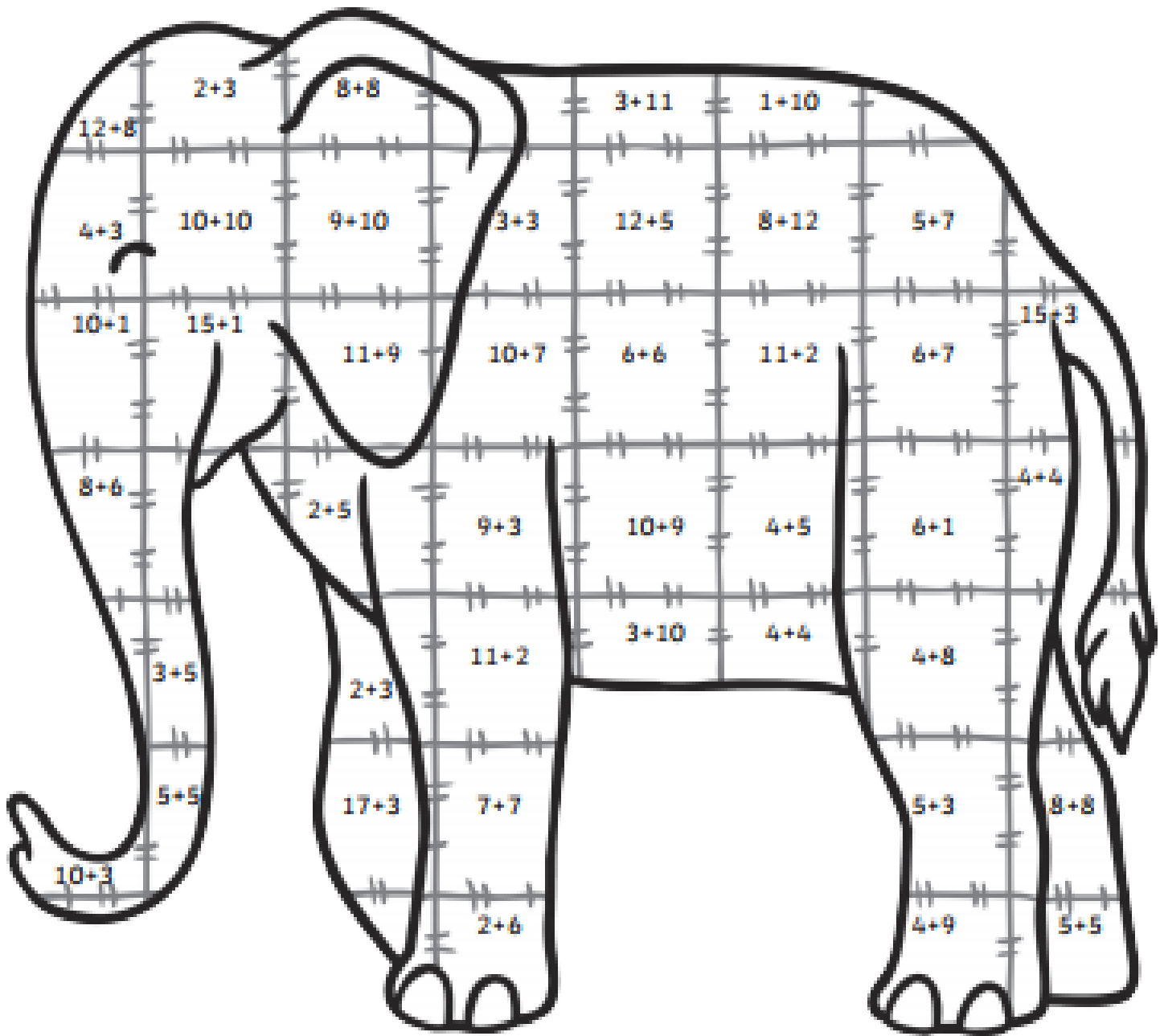
Literacy Homework
