SUMMER SUN

SPORTS DAY TIMINGS

Parents are welcome to come and watch to support the children. Junior children will be choosing their events on 4th June.

HEADLICE

There have recently been a couple of cases of head lice identified in school. While lice are nothing more than a nuisance, it is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and before they can be allowed to spread. As there have been a couple of cases, we would ask you to check your child's head as soon as possible.

WHATSAPP

We are increasingly concerned about the inappropriate use of WhatsApp by pupils in Years 3–6, with incidents of distress caused by online group messages. Please note that the minimum age for WhatsApp is 16, and its misuse poses safeguarding risks. Alarming, an unknown adult was recently added to a group and shared inappropriate content, exposing children's names and phone numbers. We urge all parents to check their child's WhatsApp groups, consider changing their number if exposed, and restrict access to age-inappropriate apps. Let's work together to keep your children safe online.
